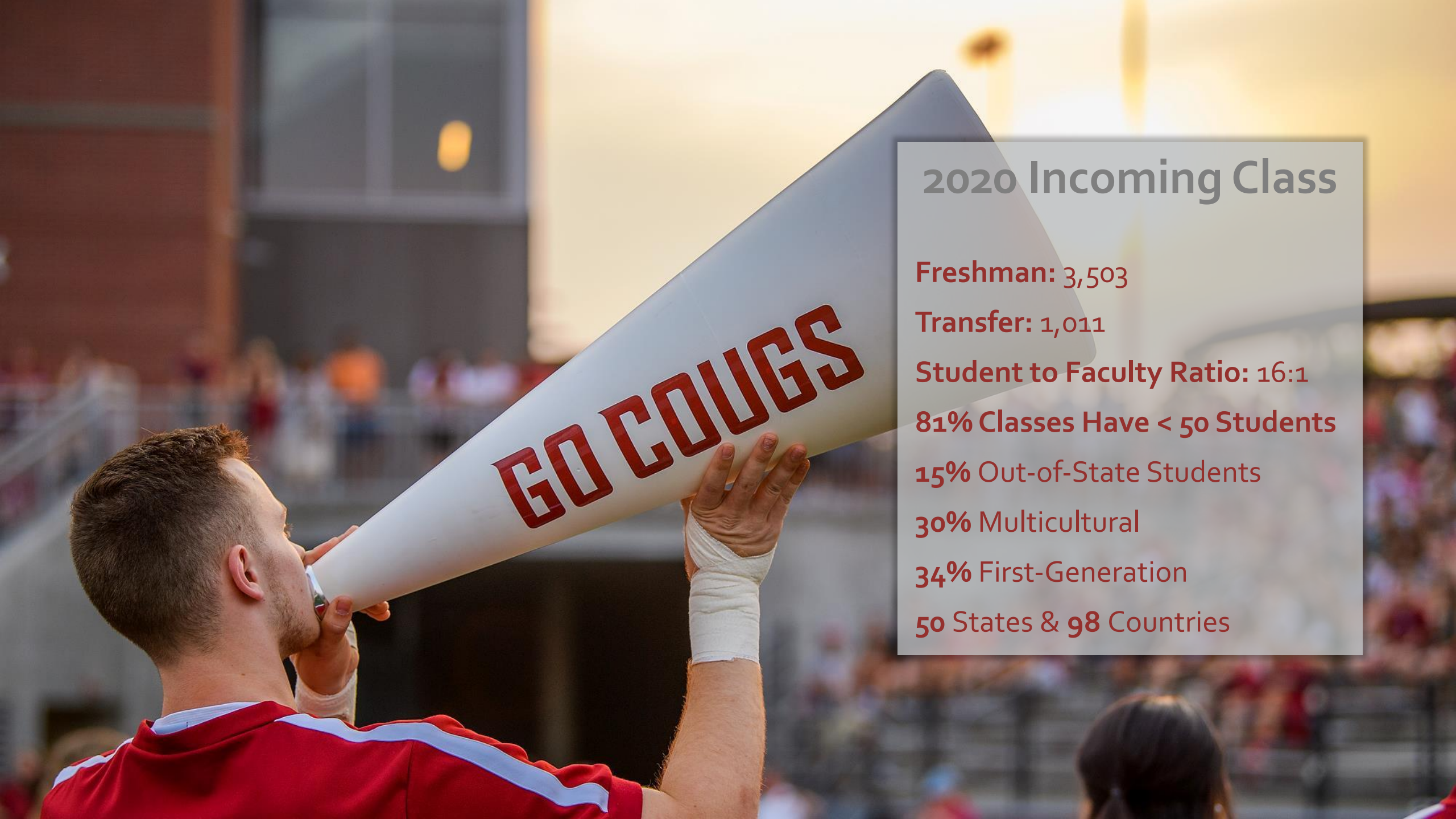


Living in Pullman

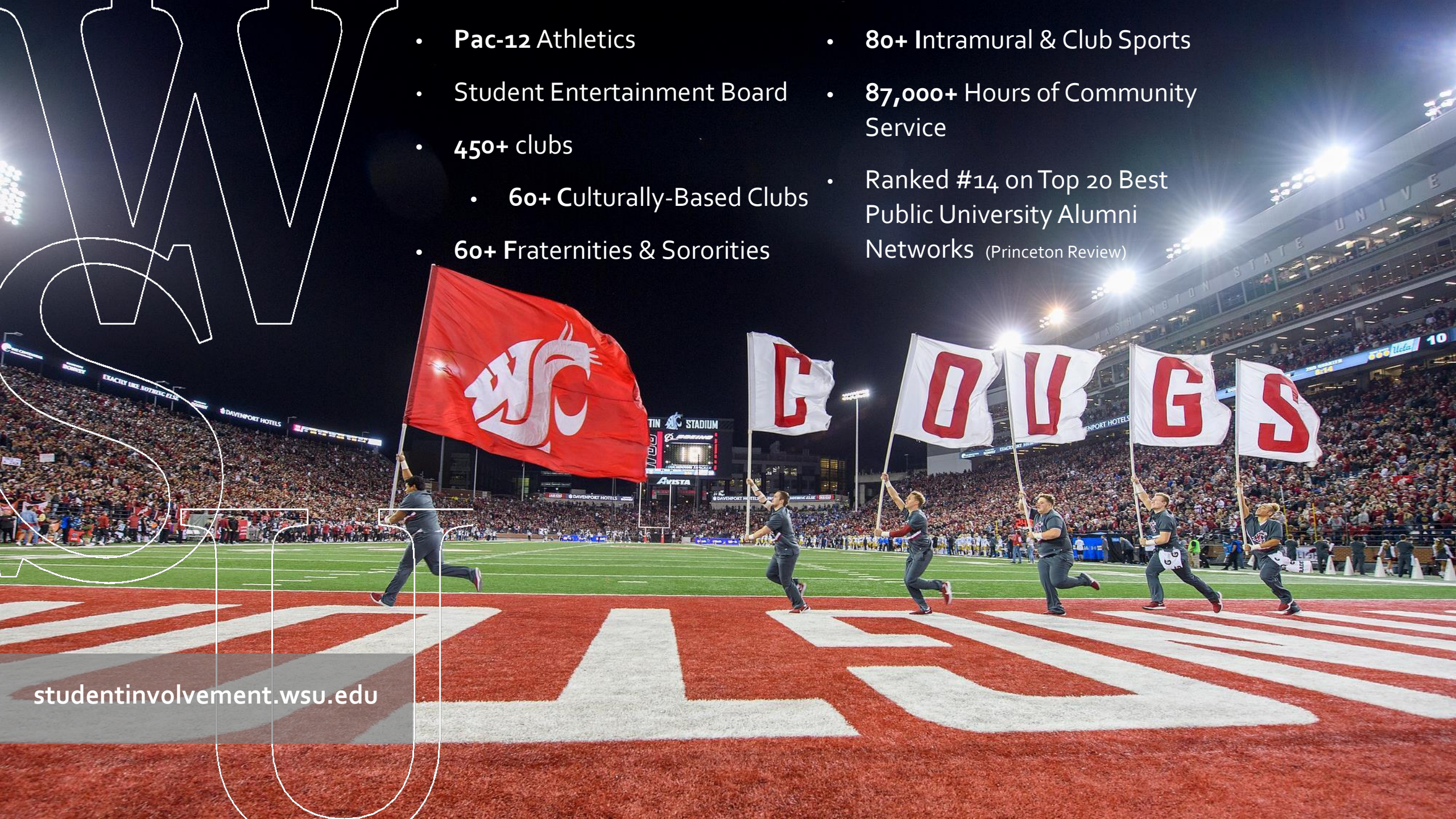

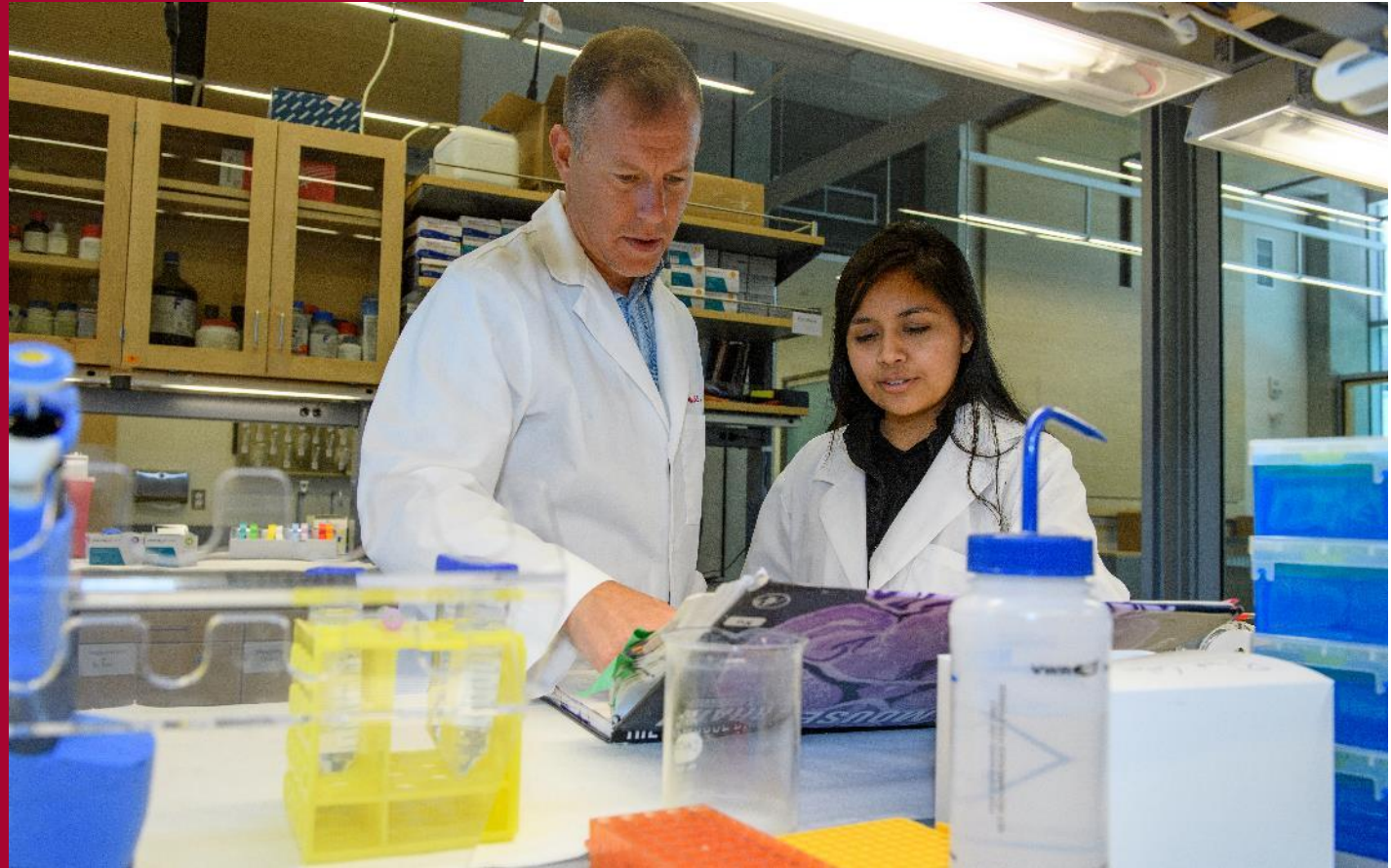

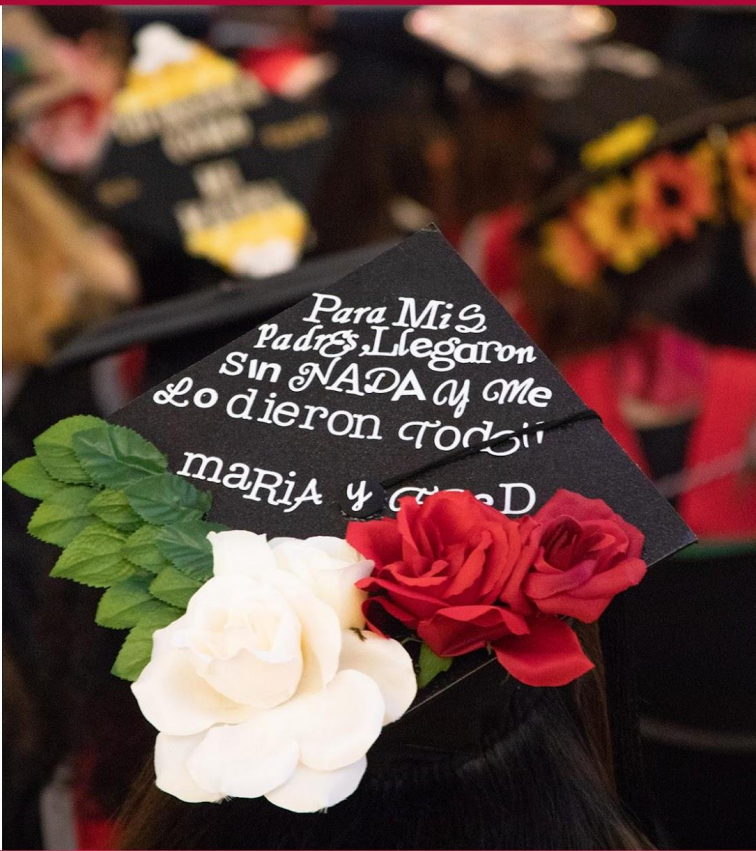

Applying as a First Year Student:

- **Complete** the application online (apply.wsu.edu) OR use the Common Application to apply.
- **\$70 Application Fee** – *fee waivers available!*
- **Submit High School Transcripts:** upload your unofficial high school transcript with your application, or have your high school send a copy.
- **SAT/ACT Not Required AND** not used for admissions or scholarship purposes.
- **Priority Deadline: March 31, 2023**

- **Send** official transcripts from all institutions attended
 - If you have less than one year of college coursework, also send us your high school transcript.
- **Priority deadlines:**
 - ***Fall applicants: July 15th***
 - ***Spring applicants: November 15th***

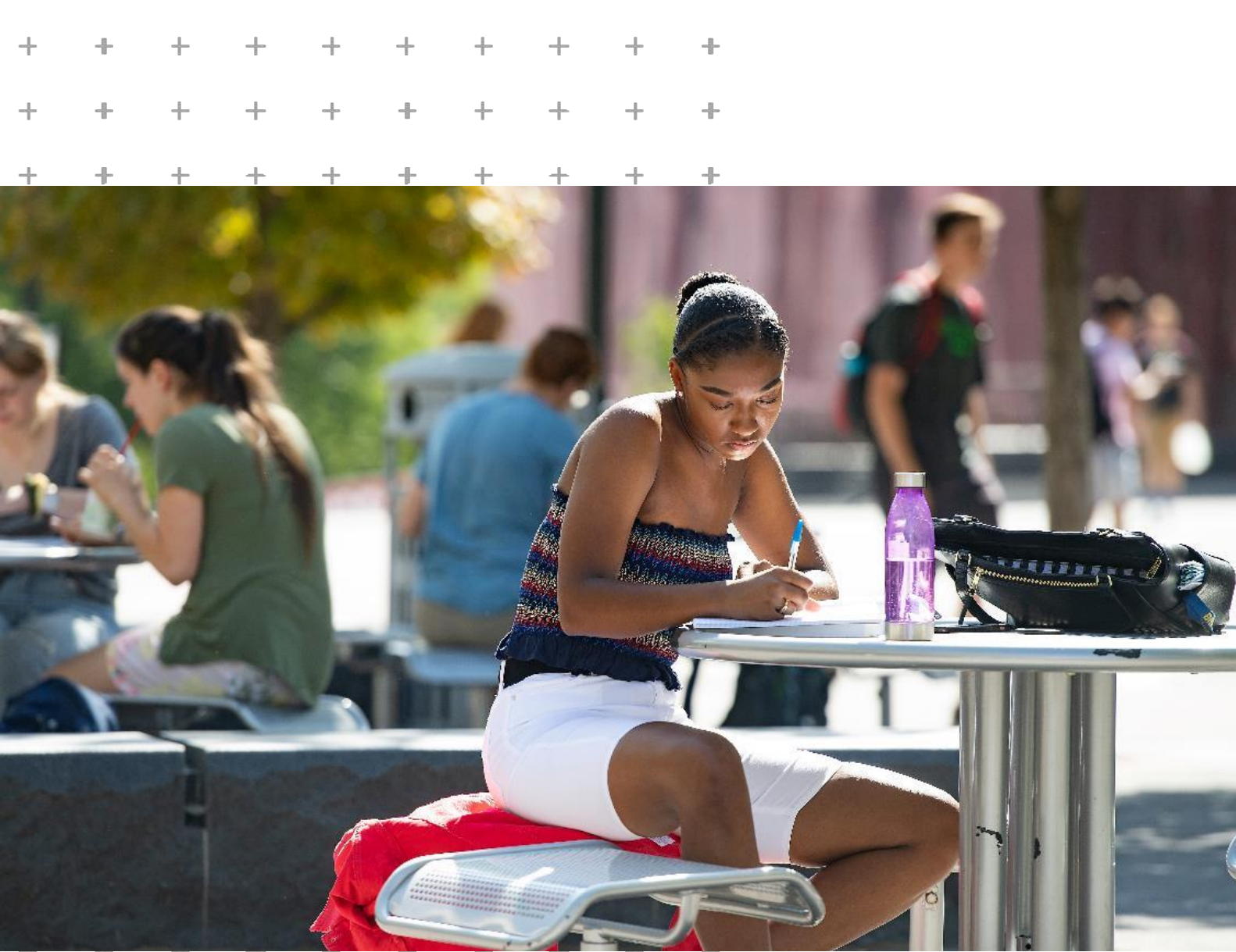
Average transfer GPA: 3.1

Crimson Transfer Award (WA Residents)

\$2,000 per year for two years

3.2 transferrable GPA with 27+ semester credits

Cougar Award for Transfers (Non – WA Residents)

\$11,000 per year for four years

3.0 transferrable GPA with 27+ semester credits
